Business Council

Fco Council

We also wanted to highlight that not all children have clean drinking water each day. The challenge was won by Enterprise council. We raised £250 towards the WE Schools Programme walk for water. This programme challenges young people to identify the local and global issues that spark their passion and empowers them with the tools to take action.
