Bird Watching

The Outdoor Learning Council have been taking part in a big bird watch. We went to find out more about what they have discovered so far. Mr Adams and more than 20 children used binoculars to spot the birds around our school. They wanted to learn more about the nature surrounding our school.

Over 5 days 225 birds were counted. The most fascinating bird seen was the Blue Tit which is blue, yellow, white and green. A garden with four or five blue tits at a feeder at any one time may be feeding 20 or more!

The rarest seen around school was the blackbird. The most inactive bird was the Hedge Sparrow although they have a great bird song. Some birds can be very clever. One of the smartest birds is the cuckoo bird who lay their eggs in other bird's nests.

The starling is also clever as they can mimic other birds.

Unfortunately, no new or strange birds were discovered however the bird watching was a success and the Council felt that they all learnt a lot. The best fact that they learnt was that there is no such thing as seagulls! There are only different types of gull.
