

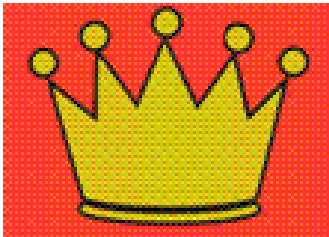

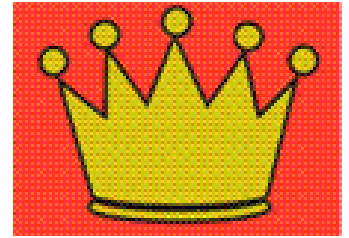

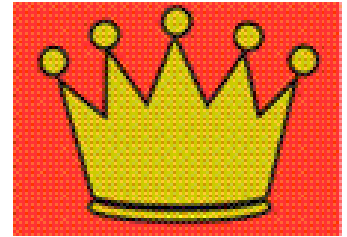

When was Hywel Dda born?

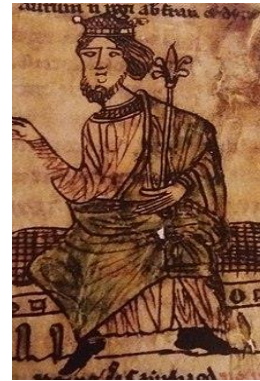
Hywel Dda was born around 880 the son of King Cadell of Seisyllwg.

When did he rule?

He reigned from 942 – 950.

When did Hywel Dda die?

He died in 950 and his Kingdom's were split.
